Exposure Visit of Delegates from Kerala

A Team of 14 delegates, comprising Principals, Academicians, IQAC Coordinators and Teachers from the Mar Thoma Higher Education Commission, Kerala, headed by Dr.M.O.Koshy, Former Pro-Chancellor, Kannur University, visited Auxilium, on 27 November 2018, to be exposed to the policy, planning and execution of the activities, involving teaching, learning, evaluation and extension. RUSA

Faculty Development Programs

Upgrading, encouraging and motivating staff to adopt current trends besides nurturing healthy relationship with students has ever been the prime concern of the Auxilium Community. To serve this interest, various formative programs were organized by the college and staff were encouraged to participate in FDP programmes organised by other colleges and universities.
