

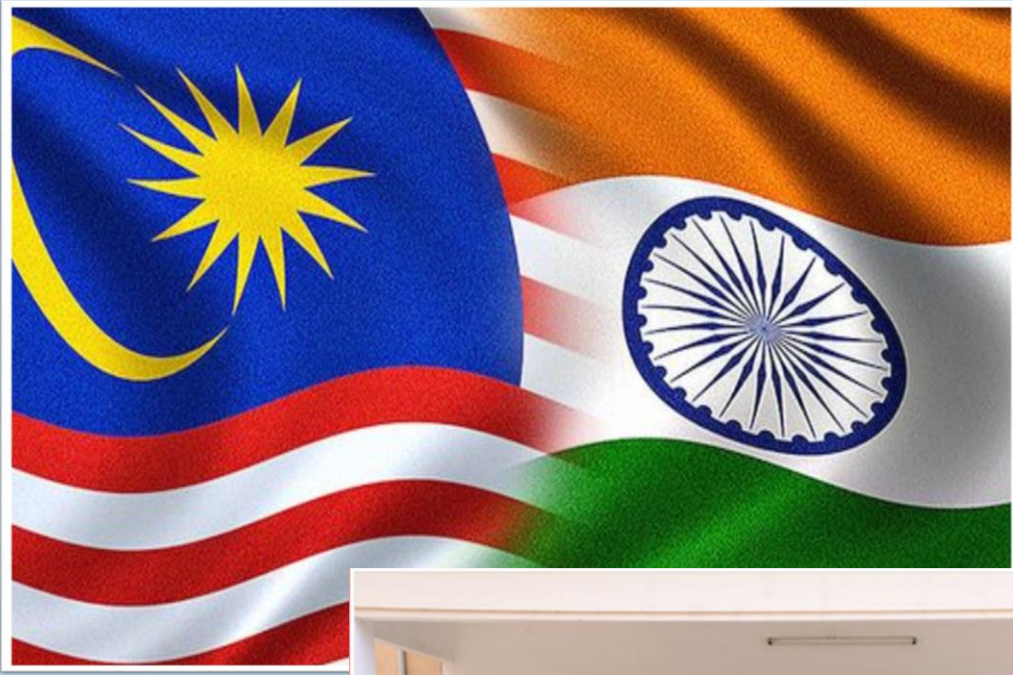

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# INDIA- MALAYSIA YOUTH EXCHANGE

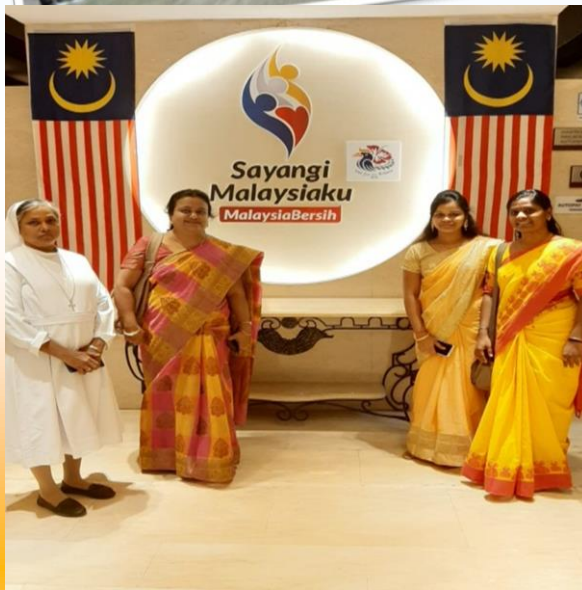

The Puchong Tamil School has 53 teachers and more than 360 students. They have three divisions of timing in which the students go to school according to their grades. There are a maximum of 25 students per class which helps the teacher to focus on the students’ needs.

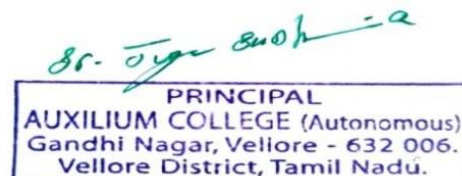
